## CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS

Re: Instructions Regarding Survey and Plans Made in Compliance with the Provisions of the Land Registry Act, B. C. Regulation 303/59

Pending the amendment of these Instructions by Regulation the Inspector of Legal Offices has agreed and has so informed the Registrars of Title to accept plans for deposit in the first four of the standard sheet sizes now used for surveys under the Land Act. The sheet size refers to the outside dimensions of the linen.

Plan sizes now acceptable to Land Registry Offices are as follows:

Size A -  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11"

B - 11" x 17"

C - 17" x 22"

 $D - 22^{n} \times 34^{n}$ 

The minimum plan width of 12 inches as previously called for by Section 4.13 of the Instructions is no longer applicable. The 30 inch maximum width allowed by subsection 10 of Section 80 of the Land Registry Act remains in force and is particularly applicable to rights of way and road survey plans which of necessity cannot conform to the standard sheet sizes.
