CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS

Sir:

Re: Sec. 80, subsection (11)
Land Registry Act.

The above-noted subsection (11) which was amended in 1967 now reads as follows:-

"(11) The plan shall be accompanied by a duplicate linen tracing and a blue or white print on print cloth or, in lieu of the duplicate tracing, by one ozalid transparency or other machine-made copy of a type approved by the Surveyor-General, together with such number of other blue or white prints as may be necessary for the purpose of taxing authorities, the Surveyor-General, and the Board of the regional district in which the land is situate (if any):".

In the interest of uniformity, if the land being dealt with by the Surveyor is within or partly within a Regional District, all Land Surveyors are directed to add the name of the Regional District on the plan in the vicinity of the approval by the appropriate approving officer. Example:- "This plan lies within the _____ Regional District."

Please ensure also that the extra print for the said Regional District is included when the plan is being tendered for deposit.
