Pursuant to the Land Registry Act, and upon the recommendation of the undersigned, the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, orders that a regulation be made in the following form:

APPROVING OFFICER (unorganized  
territory), ADDITIONAL REASON  
FOR REFUSAL TO APPROVE PLAN OF  
SUBDIVISION


The Approving Officer for unorganized territory may refuse to approve a plan of subdivision if the plan does not have the prior consent in writing of the Minister of Highways whose consent shall be limited to considering the likely contribution of the subdivision to urban sprawl in relation to any nearby established community and the cost of providing services.
