CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS

Dear Sir:

Re: Tape Standardization Base -
Municipality of Surrey.

This is to advise that a three hundred-foot tape standardization base was established in Whalley by G.C. Emerson, B.C.L.S., and in May 1974, the Surveys and Mapping Branch of the Department of Lands, Forests and Water Resources calibrated the base. It is now available for use by British Columbia Land Surveyors and others.

The base is marked by three lead plugs in the northerly sidewalk of King George Highway and lies between Bolivar Road and the Yellow Rose Motel. The lead plugs are 0.50 feet distant from the northerly edge of the sidewalk. The distances tabulated below refer to the distances between points which are marked by the centres of the tacks in the lead plugs and the 0 point is the most southerly lead plug:

Base values, May 1974: 0 - 100 = 100.008'
 100 - 300 = 199.973'
