CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS AND REGISTRARS.

Dear Sirs:

Re: General Instructions for Cadastral Surveys in Integrated Survey Areas - B.C.Reg. 576/74.

Sec. 4.01 (b) requires that one of two notes (concerning ground level measured distances and sea level or combined factors) be shown on all plans within an integrated survey area.

When the coordinates are converted from the present polyconic system to the U.T.M. system the note concerning the combined factor will always be required. While the use of polyconic coordinates continues the note is, however, redundant for areas with elevations close to sea level and Sec. 4.01 (b) shall be considered not to apply to the following:

Integrated Survey Area No. 1 - Surrey

Integrated Survey Area No. 10 - Cowichan

Integrated Survey Area No. 11 - Duncan

Integrated Survey Area No. 13 - Delta

until coordinates are converted to the U.T.M. system. In all other integrated survey areas declared to this date, Sec. 4.01(b) shall apply and the appropriate note regarding the sea level factor shall be shown on all plans of survey.

The factor shall be obtained with sufficient accuracy from the formula:- $\frac{6\ 385\ 000}{6\ 385\ 000\ +\ E} \quad \text{and given to 6 decimal places}$ where E is the mean elevation in metres of the area of the survey.
