TO ALL BRITISH COLUMBIA LAND SURVEYORS

Re: New Process for Requesting Parcel Designations and Land Act Plan Submission Requirements

Parcel Designations

All e-mail requests for *Land Act* and *Mineral Tenure Act* parcel designations must be sent to the following e-mail address: sgbdesig@victoria1.gov.bc.ca

Members are encouraged to use the e-mail request process to obtain parcel designations, however, mail and facsimile (250-387-1830) requests will continue to be accepted. The preferred format for e-mail file attachments is Adobe Acrobat PDF, however JPEG, GIF and TIFF attachments will also be accepted.

Please note that requests for parcel designations must include a copy of the accepted offer of grant or lease and the proposed survey sketch attached to the offer. Where Land and Water British Columbia Inc. (LWBC) is contracting directly with a land surveyor, the parcel designation request must include the LWBC file number, the proposed survey sketch and a note that the project is a contract survey. LWBC contract surveys are exempt from survey plan submission fees.

Land Act Plan Submission Requirements

Section 28 (1) (e) of the General Survey Instruction Regulation states:

"additional requirements for Land Act surveys as follows:

- (i) two preliminary paper prints;
- (ii) final submission of one original mylar;"

Preliminary plans must no longer be submitted. *Land Act* plans must also have the government file number appended beneath the Surveyor General's signature block.

The General Survey Instruction Regulation will be amended to reflect this change in due course.
