SUPPLEMENTARY INSTRUCTIONS TO

The Instructions Regarding the Legal Survey
of Rights-of-Way, dated June 15, 1956.

(Regarding the Tying and Posting of Mineral Claim Surveys
Crossed by a Right-of-Way, being Surveyed)

The Instructions will be amplified by the following rules:

- 2(h) Surveyed Mineral claim boundaries which are tied by field survey, as required by para. 3(e), will be posted at their intersection with both boundaries of the right-of-way. Indicated, calculated intersections will not be posted.
- 3(e) Surveyed Mineral Claims of all categories other than those to which a Crown Grant of the surface has been issued, shall be tied as follows:
- (i) Isolated surveyed claims - two posts of the survey to be located (or a similar tie made to another survey to which the Mineral Claim has been tied) and intersections of all mineral claim boundaries crossed by the right-of-way calculated and indicated on the plan, with the acreage of the right-of-way shown.
 - (ii) Groups of surveys (a few covering less than a mile of length of right-of-way) - two posts of one Mineral Claim to be tied and all boundary intersections of all claims with the right-of-way boundaries to be calculated and indicated on the plan with separate acreages in each claim. The claims so indicated will be dimensioned from their official survey plans.
 - (iii) Groups of surveys covering more than one mile of length of right-of-way - should be tied as per the preceding paragraph, with one tie every mile.

Surveyed mineral claims to which a Crown Grant of the surface has been issued will be tied as per para. 3(a) and posted as per para. 2(a).
